- Watch the movie and prepare a space for discussion afterward.

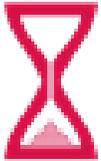
### Discussion Questions:

  - Glass (colored and clear)
  - Paper (newspaper, magazines, printer paper, mail, etc.)
  - Plastic (numbers 1 through 7)
  - Metals (tin and aluminum)
  - In special containers
    - Cardboard (outdoor cages)
    - Rechargeable batteries (tube in indoor recycling center)

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- Ink cartridges (tube in indoor recycling center)
