MU	ST HAVES:  Reusable Water Bottle - If you drink one bottle a day, you'll save at least \$95.00 over the course of the school year (and that's at Costco prices).
	Reusable Shopping Bags - They're not only stronger, but some stores (like Target) will give you a 5 cent discount per bag.
	<b>Power Strip</b> - Turn off power to all your electronics at once to avoid energy loss which contributes to more carbon dioxide in the air.
	Compact Florescent Light Bulbs - Using only a fraction of the power, these bulbs limit your utility use and, therefore, create a smaller carbon footprint. Please note: these bulbs should not be thrown away. If you live on campus, put in a work order and someone will pick up your broken/dead bulb and dispose of it responsibly.

	<b>Reuse!</b> Think about what you can buy at thrift stores so there is less negative impact on the earth from your purchase.
	<b>Buy Energy Star</b> - Everything from computers to TVs; make sure your electronics carry this seal, ensuring a higher amount of energy efficiency.
	<b>Purchase Sustainable Textiles</b> - Consider buying organic cotton or recycled content bedding and towels.
	Consider Alternative Transportation - Do your really need a car (and to pay for the cost of parking on campus)? Did you know that Parking and Transportation has car share and ride share programs, complete with a fleet of Prius', Smart Cars, and even a Nissan Leaf? Or, for getting around campus, they have a free bike share program!
	<b>Recycled Content Plastic</b> - When purchasing shower caddys or storage bins, look for post consumer recycled content. The higher the better!
